HISTORY OF INDIAN FLAG

- 1. The National Flag of India was adopted in its present form during the meeting of Constituent Assembly held on the 22 July 1947, a few days before India's independence from the British on 15 August, 1947. It served as the national flag of the Dominion of India between 15 August 1947 and 26 January 1950 and that of the Republic of India thereafter. In India, the term "tricolour" refers to the Indian national flag.
- 2. The National flag of India is a horizontal tricolor of deep saffron (kesari) at the top, white in the middle and dark green at the bottom in equal proportion. The ratio of width of the flag to its length is two to three. In the centre of the white band is a navy blue wheel which represents the chakra. Its design is that of the wheel which appears on the abacus of the Sarnath Lion Capital of Ashoka. Its diameter approximates to the width of the white band and it has 24 spokes represents 24 hours in a day.

- (ii) Lights off timing for Board Classes may be extended until 2300 Hrs for Board Exam Preparations.

CODE OF CONDUCT TO BE FOLLOWED IN THE SCHOOL

For Cadets-

- 1. Always remain smart, clean and be well dressed.
- 2. Maintain personal hygiene, a proper haircut and cleanliness of your surroundings.
- 3. Speak in English all the time. Learn to speak fluently, clearly and with courtesy.
- 4. Demonstrate respect for all.
- 5. Be courteous, accept individual differences, no put downs or harassment.
- 6. Do not disparage or embarrass others in the school.
- 7. Take care of school property.
- 8. Be punctual and regular for classes, games and activities.
- 9. Be at the right place at the right time in the right dress.
- 10. Respect and follow the instructions of teachers and other staff members.
- 11. Remain positive in your attitude and conduct.
- 12. Take pride in your nation, yourself, your school and your parents.
- 13. Be truthful and do not be afraid to speak the truth or to accept a mistake.
- 14. All residences of staff are out of bounds.

For Parents-

- 1. Parents may visit their wards on promulgated "Book Out" (4th Saturday) which are once in a month. The time for the visit is from 0900hrs to 1300 hrs. You are requested to refrain from visiting the school on other days. In case of any emergency please contact the AO/VP.
- 2. Out pass is sanctioned only on medical grounds on the recommendations of the School Nursing Assistant. No other form of out pass is permitted. You are requested to plan all religious and family engagements during the term breaks only.
- 3. All dormitories have one telephone each. Your ward may contact you twice a week. This is to ensure that every child gets a chance to talk to his parents regularly. In case of any emergency, you may contact the House master directly. In case of any problem faced by your ward, you must contact the CT/HM/AO/VP/PPL.
- 4. Please do not hand over money or send money orders to your ward. They are not permitted to keep any money in person or in dormitories.
- 5. Security Guards at the entrance gates of the school have been briefed to ascertain the bonafides of all people entering and leaving the school. Please co-operate with the security personnel in this regard. Remember, that this is being done to ensure the safety of your children inside the school campus. No one has been exempted from this.
- 6. Helmets/Seat belts are compulsory within the school campus. Speed limit for all vehicles will be 30km per hour.
- 7. Parking of vehicles is permitted only on left side parking shed of the main entrance gate of the school. Parents are requested not to take their vehicles beyond this point inside the school campus on any occasion. Cadets are not permitted to drive any vehicle inside the campus.
- 8. Please follow all the traffic rules and regulations strictly.
- 9. The school campus is a litter free and polythene free zone. Wrappers and polythene bags brought by the parents will be taken out by them and not littered around the campus. You are advised to bring a bag with you for carrying back left over food, wrappers etc.
- 10. Parents are also requested not to smoke, drink or chew paan or tobacco product inside the school campus.
- 11. Parents are requested to pay the fees as per the schedule.

- 12. Cadets are not permitted to keep mobile phones or any other electronic items. Parents are sincerely advised not to give such items to their wards. Strict disciplinary action deemed fit will be initiated against the defaulters as per R & R of Sainik Schools.
- 13. No overnight out pass will be issued to cadets unless they have genuine reason.
- 14. Parents visiting their wards are requested to refrain from entering the Dormitories, Hostels and Residential Areas of Staff members.
- 15. Security Guards patrolling the campus have been briefed to ensure and enforce the regulations cited above. In case of any problems please contact the Vice Principal/Admin Officer.

CODE OF CONDUCT TO BE FOLLOWED IN THE HOUSE

- 1. The houses are out of bound while the classes are going on.
- 2. Keep your belongings neatly in your cupboard and trunks. Your dormitory should be tidy.
- 3. Do not play with a ball, racket or hockey sticks in the dormitories, classrooms and corridors.
- 4. Do not borrow or lend any items of the kit from other cadets. Report to the housemaster or ward boy when you need something or have misplaced something.
- 5. No cadet, who is ill, will be allowed to remain in the dormitory unless the ward boy or housemaster gives him permission.
- 6. Cadets should remain in their respective houses during non-training hours. They are also not permitted to visit the house of staff members.
- 7. The infirmary is also out of bound except for those who have reported sick. If you are sick or in need of medical help, you must first approach your housemaster or ward boy.
- 8. Never enter the mess in improper uniform. At the dining table, learn to pass the food to others first, eat in decent way and never waste the food.
- 9. Cadets are not allowed to bring any expensive articles in the houses.
- 10. It is dangerous to play or tamper with electrical installations. Ensure the lights and fans are switched off when you do not require them.

COMPANY HAVILDAR MAJOR PIRU SINGH

Company Havildar Major Piru Singh was born on May 20, 1918 in Beri Village of Jhunjhunu, Rajasthan. He was enrolled in the 6th Rajputana Riffles on May 20, 1936. During the Jammu and Kashmir operations in summer of 1948, Pakistani raiders mounted a strong counter offensive in the Tithwal sector. The enemy also forced the Indian Army to vacate their forward positions across river Kishanganga. After the setback, Indian troops took position on the Tithwal ridge. CHM Piru Singh laid down his life in a brave fight against the enemies, leaving for the rest of his comrades a unique example of single – handed bravery and determined



courage. He was honoured with the highest wartime gallantry medal, Param Vir Chakra, posthumously.

NAIB SUBEDAR BANA SINGH

Naib Subedar Bana Singh, born in Kadyal, Jammu on January 6, 1949, was enrolled in the Indian Army on January 6, 1969 into the Jammu and Kashmir Light Infantry (JAK LI). During June 1987, the 8th JAK LI, was deployed in the Siachen area. Naib Subedar Bana Singh volunteered to join the special task force formed to root out Pakistani infiltrators. Naib Subedar Bana Singh led his men through an extremely difficult and hazardous route. Lobbing hand – grenades, charging with bayonet and moving from trench to trench, he cleared the post of all intruders. He was awarded the Param Vir Chakra, the highest wartime gallantry medal,




for conspicuous bravery and leadership under most adverse conditions.

CAPTAIN VIKRAM BATRA

Captain Vikram Batra, 13 Jammu and Kashmir Rifles, and his Delta Company were given the task of recapturing point 5140. Captain Batra single – handedly engaged three enemy soldiers in close combat and killed them. He was seriously injured during this combat, but instead of regrouping his men to continue with the given task at hand. Inspired by the extraordinary courage displayed by Captain Batra, the soldiers of 13 JAK RIF charged the enemy position and captured point 5140 at 0330 a.m. on June 20, 1999. Captain Batra led his men to even more glorious victories with the recapture of point 4750 and point 4875.



He was tragically killed, when he tried to rescue an injured officer during an enemy counter attack. For his sustained display of the most conspicuous personal bravery, Captain Vikram Batra was awarded the Param Vir Chakra, India's highest medal for gallantry, posthumously.

LIEUTENANT MANOJ KUMAR PANDEY

Lieutenant Manoj Kumar Pandey, 1/11 Gorkha Rifles, forced back the intruders from the Batalik sector on June 11, 1999. He led his men to recapture he Jaubar top, a feature of great operational importance. But his finest hour was in the capture of Khalubar in the early morning hours of July 03, 1999. On the night of July 2-3, 1999 the Battalion's progress onto its final objective was halted by a determined enemy firmly entrenched on commanding



heights. The young officer led his platoon along a narrow treacherous ridge that led to the enemy position. He surged ahead of his troops and charged at the enemy with a full-throated battle cry through a hail of bullets. Although wounded in the shoulder and leg, he pressed on his solitary charge with grim determination. Critically bleeding, he collapsed at the final bunker and finally succumbed to his injuries but not before the last of the enemy had been annihilated. Lieutenant Manoj Kumar Pandey was awarded the Param Vir Chakra, India's highest medal for gallantry, posthumously.

NATIONAL CADET CORPS



- 1. The **National Cadet Corps** (NCC) is the youth wing of the Indian Armed Forces with its headquarters in New Delhi, India. National Cadet Corps came into being by an Act of the Parliament Act No. XXXI of 1948 designated 'The National Cadet Corps Act 1948'. This Act with 13 clauses, prescribed the formation of the National Cadet Corps in India.
- 2. National Cadet Corps is a Tri-Services Organization, comprising the Army, Navy and Air Force, engaged in grooming the youth of the country into disciplined and patriotic citizens. The National Cadet Corps in India is a voluntary organization which recruits cadets from high schools, colleges and Universities all over India. The Cadets are given basic military training in small arms and parades.
- 3. The emblem of the NCC consists of 3 colours; red, dark blue and light blue. These colours represent the Indian Army, Indian Navy and Indian Air Force respectively. The 17 lotuses indicate the 17 directorates.
- 4. The NCC is the world's largest uniformed youth organization. Its motto is 'Unity and Discipline'.

AIM OF NCC

The 'Aims' of the NCC laid out in 1988 have stood the test of time and continue to meet the requirements expected of it in the current socio—economic scenario of the country. The NCC aims at developing character, comradeship, discipline, a secular outlook, the spirit of adventure and ideals of selfless service amongst young citizens. Further, it aims at creating a pool of organized, trained and motivated youth with leadership qualities in all walks of life, who will serve the Nation regardless of which career they choose. Needless to say, the NCC also provides an environment conducive to motivating young Indians to join the armed forces.

- 1. To Create a Human Resource of Organized, Trained and Motivated Youth, To Provide Leadership in all Walks of life and be Always Available for the Service of the Nation.
- 2. To Provide a Suitable Environment to Motivate the Youth to Take Up a Career in the Armed Forces.
- 3. To Develop Character, Comradeship, Discipline, Leadership, Secular Outlook, Spirit of Adventure, and Ideals of Selfless Service amongst the Youth of the Country.

NATIONAL DEFENCE ACADEMY



The National Defence Academy (NDA) is the Joint Services academy of the Indian Armed Forces, where cadets of the three services, the Army, the Navy and the Air Force train together before they go on to respective service academies for further pre-commissioning training. The NDA is located at Khadakwasla near Pune, Maharashtra. It is the first tri-service academy in the world.

Applicants to the NDA are selected via a written exam conducted by the UPSC, followed by extensive interview by the SSB. The eligibility criteria are as under:



"Ragging is any disorderly conduct, whether by words spoken or written, or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any student, indulging in rowdy or indiscipline activities which cause or are likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the psyche of a fresher or a junior student."

ANY ACT RESULTING IN

- Physical, mental, verbal & sexual abuse.
- Indecent behaviour.
- Any act that disrupts the regular academic activity of a student.
- Undermining human dignity.
- Financial exploitation/ extortion.
- Use of force in the name of seniority.
- Criminal intimidation/ wrongful restraint.

RAGGING MAY RESULT INTO

- Suspension/ Withdrawal from the school
- Withdrawal of scholarship/ other benefits
- Lodging of an 'F.I.R.' in Police Station
- Imprisonment upto three years

CHILD HELPLINE NUMBER- 1098

THE PROTECTION OF CHILDREN FROM SEXUAL OFFENCE ACT, 2019

An Act to protect children from offences of sexual assault, sexual harassment and pornography and provide for establishment of Special Courts for trial of such offences and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE IS

- Sexual touching of any part of the body, clothed or unclothed.
- Encouraging a child to engage in sexual activity.
- Indulgence in sex with a child.
- Intentionally engaging in sexual activity in front of a child.
- Showing children pornography or using children to create pornography.
- Adult showing his or her private part to the child or vice versa.

CIRCUMSTANCES OF AGGRAVATION

- Offender also seriously injuring or threatening to seriously injure victim.
- Offender being in a group of people when they commit offence.

KNOW

- To say 'NO' to any such advances
- Inform trusted adult

TEACHERS TO APPROACH CHILD IF THEY NOTICE

- Excessive crying
- An increase in irritability
- Aggression towards others
- Bedwetting or soiling of pants
- Becoming withdrawn

GOOD TOUCH (SAFE TOUCH)

Hugs and kisses and touches from people we know, love and trust are good touches. Good touches give us good feelings and make us feel warm inside. A little girl on dad's lap, child on his mother's lap hugging are examples of good touch as both parent and child are comfortable with the touch.

BAD TOUCH (UNSAFE TOUCH)

Same kind of touches from people we do not know or do not like or do not trust could be bad touches. Bad touches make us feel bad or uncomfortable. It is the touch we would want to stop right away. A child being tickled and is not liking it is an example of bad touch. Hitting, kicking or touching private parts are some other examples of bad touch.
